SURVEY METHODOLOGY



Sampling frame of Cottonwood Heights residents consisted of a universe of registered voters contacted via email and supplemented by postal mail survey invitations.

In total, we emailed 11,087 invitations and sent 2,000 mailers. 1,869 emails bounced due to either incorrect email addresses or high spam filter settings resulting in a deliverability rate of 86%.*

Of the 11,218 total delivered invitations, 1,531 citizens responded by completing online surveys. This results in a response rate of approximately 13.6% overall. Each email address or mailed invitee could respond only once.

1,531 interviews among an estimated adult population of 34,238 results in a margin of error for the survey of plus or minus 2.45 percentage points. Responses were weighted to better approximate city demographic composition.


CITY DIRECTION & PERCEPTIONS

Overall, would you say the city of Cottonwood Heights is headed in the right direction or the wrong direction?




Of residents that express an opinion, 80% say Cottonwood Heights is headed in the right direction.

All things considered, on a scale from 0 to 100, with 0 being very low and 100 being very high, how would you rate your overall quality of life in Cottonwood Heights?




COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS ELECTED OFFICIALS

Do you approve or disapprove of how the Cottonwood Heights Mayor and City Council are handling their jobs?




COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS NOW AND THEN

In your opinion, what is the most important issue facing Cottonwood Heights today?




MOST IMPORTANT ISSUE — IN THE FUTURE

In your opinion, what is the most important issue facing Cottonwood Heights in the next 3-5 years?




RECOMMENDING COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS

How likely are you to recommend the City of Cottonwood Heights to others as a good place to live?




VALUE FOR TAX DOLLAR

63% of respondents are satisfied with the service they receive for their tax dollar in Cottonwood Heights.




In general, how do you rate the service you receive from Cottonwood Heights for your tax dollar?





"I am grateful that changes have been made to snow removal services for the coming year." "I love the police department, they are on the ball!"

"Car and home burglaries are out of control."

"The detectives that helped recover my stolen property this past week were top notch. Many thanks to them. Code enforcement could be more proactive."


"The low score on snow removal is from the last few years."

"I don't want sidewalks on residential streets, at least don't retrofit old neighborhoods with new sidewalks. Save my tax dollars and put them to use somewhere else and I'll walk in the street and be just fine."


"Emergency services tend to be much slower than seems acceptable.

We asked residents to prioritize government services in Cottonwood Heights by having them allocate funding to a variety of services.



The chart below shows the distributions of funding amounts for each city service, ordered from highest average funding allocation to lowest. Most residents distributed funds fairly evenly, with more money going to parks, snow removal, roads, police, and fire.



'OTHER' RESPONSES SPECIFIED

Dog parks, bikes and mass-transit, and tax refunds were among the top items listed in the 'Other' category.



From which source do you currently receive most of your information about the City of Cottonwood Heights?




PREFERRED CHANNEL FOR CITY INFORMATION

From which source would you prefer to receive most of your information about the City of Cottonwood Heights?





During the past year have you contacted any Cottonwood Heights office to seek service, information, or to file a complaint?




PERSONAL EXPERIENCE WITH CITY STAFF

"I get the feeling that they like to pass the buck and transfer you to someone else instead of just getting it done."




DEVELOPMENT & TRADE-OFFS




INCREASED DEVELOPMENT VS PROPERTY TAXES




WALKABILITY VS. ROAD MAINTENANCE




TAXES FOR PARKS AND OPEN SPACES

69% of respondents stated their willingness to support an increase in taxes if the funds were used to purchase land for parks and open spaces.




Would you support or oppose an increase in taxes if Cottonwood Heights used the funds to purchase land that would be developed into parks or preserved as open spaces?
