Parade Guidelines

The purpose of the Butlerville Days Parade is to celebrate Cottonwood Heights' heritage in a hometown manner that is suitable for people of all ages to view and participate.

Official Rules and Regulations:

- 1. Check-in and staging will begin at 7:15 a.m. You must be in the staging area before 8:30 a.m. The parade's start time is 9 a.m.
- 2. Only parade entry vehicles and their towing vehicles are permitted in the staging area.
- 3. All motorized vehicles must be operated by valid licensed drivers.
- 4. The parade is a community event and not a platform for discussing public issues or politics. Campaigning is prohibited.
- 5. Participants who are representing Cottonwood Heights in their elected capacity are permitted to participate in the parade.
- 6. Distribution of flyers is strongly discouraged along the parade route. We want to ensure that the street waterways remain clean and free from any debris.
- 7. All walkers must maintain a 5-foot distance from any vehicle, float, or trailer.
- 8. If your parade entry involves both a vehicle and walkers, it is required to provide an adult walker/safety person. This individual is responsible for monitoring the vehicle and ensuring the safety of both the walkers and the spectators.
- 9. Parade participants are not allowed to throw objects (candy or trinkets) from vehicles or floats.
 - a. Designated candy distributors are required to walk alongside the parade entry and handout candy. Distributors must avoid hitting parade participants or spectators with candy.
 - b. The adult walker is the only person who can retrieve more candy from a vehicle. The vehicle must come to a full stop before candy can be retrieved. The adult walker will inform the driver when it is safe to proceed.
- 10. No one under the age of 12 can stand on a moving vehicle, trailer, or float.
- 11. Occupants of a float or vehicle are not allowed to get off or on the vehicle unless the float or vehicle is stopped, and the adult walker/safety person coordinates the movement.
- 12. All parade entries must have adequate adult supervisors for walking participants with no vehicle. If there is a vehicle, the rules above apply.
- 13. Spraying water at parade spectators along the route is strictly prohibited. The use of water guns and/or water balloons is also not permitted in the parade.
- 14. The float, group, or organization is solely responsible for their own safety, liability, and operations. Routines should be designed to permit constant forward movement.
